BLUE SPRING

EACH DAY, FROM A DEPTH OF 120 FEET, 104,000,000 GALLONS OF 72 DEGREE WATER SURGE UP FROM THE LIMESTONE CAVERNS BELOW.

THIS WATER BEGAN AS LAST YEAR'S RAIN FALLING ON THE UPLANDS EAST OF THE PARK WHERE IT SEEPED DOWN THROUGH THE SANDY SOIL AND INTO THE POROUS LIMESTONE AND FINALLY EMERGES HERE, AT A LOWER ELEVATION, TO FORM A SPRING.

FEW FISH ARE SEEN HERE BECAUSE OF THE LOW OXYGEN CONTENT OF THE WATER AND THE ABSENCE OF AQUATIC PLANTS. HOWEVER, AFTER FLOWING ABOUT 100 YARDS ABOVE GROUND, OXYGEN IS ABSORBED INTO THE WATER AND MANY KINDS OF FISH BEGIN TO APPEAR.

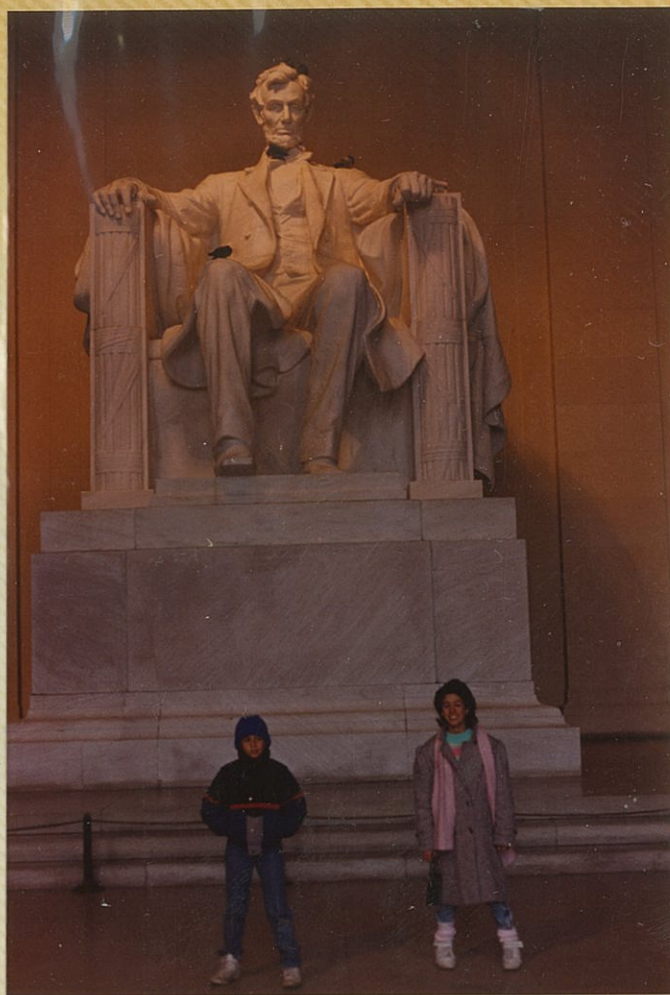

The Expos still had the championship within reach, when during their last at bat they put a man on first

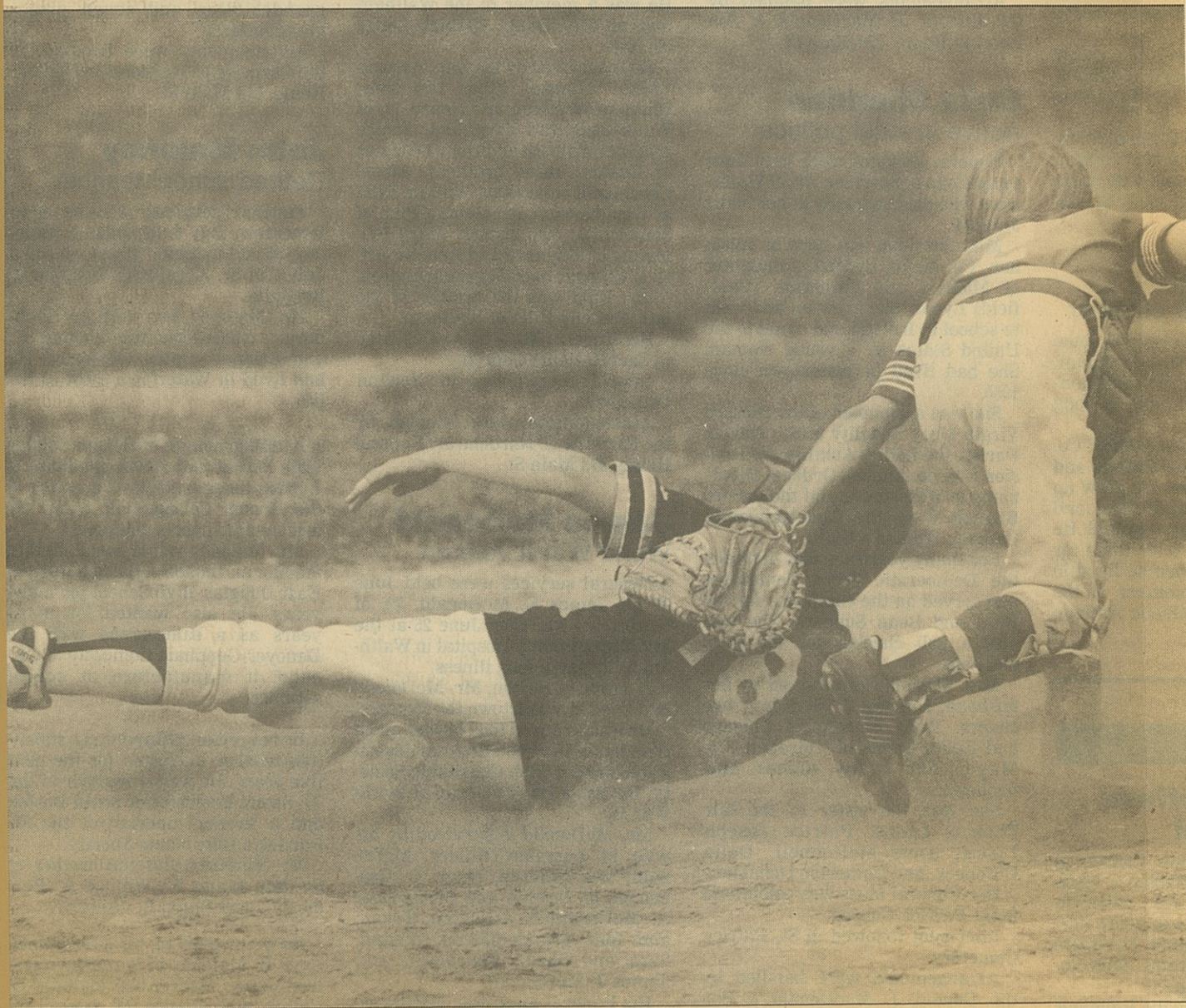
and second base. The Expos threw the ball into the Royals' hands.
