DAY 1, Saturday, September 22. BOARD YOUR OVERNIGHT TRANSATLANTIC FLIGHT.

DAY 2, Sunday, September 23.

ARRIVAL IN SHANNON, IRELAND. TO BUNRATTY.

Lots to see and do within a short walk: the folk park, a "village" of thatched cottages, farmhouses, and shops depicting turn-of-the-century Irish life; a complex of smart shops in which to browse; and perhaps a refreshment

DAY 3, Monday, September 24. **BUNRATTY-LIMERICK-KILLARNEY.**

DAY 5, Wednesday, September 26. KILLARNEY. RING OF KERRY EXCURSION.

Unhurried sightseeing follows the popular scenic drive on the southwestern tip of Ireland - the Ring of Kerry. Focus your camera on sparkling seascapes, mountains dotted with brightly colored farmhouses, winding lanes bordered with subtropical vegetation, and the breathtaking panorama of the Lakes of Killarney from Ladies View. A special treat: a fun-filled, horsedrawn jaunting car ride to Muckross House gardens amidst some of the most spectacular scenery in Ireland. Tonight an entertaining optional evening in Tralee with dinner at the Galleon Restaurant and tickets for Siamsa Tire National Folk Theatre.

DAY 6, Thursday, September 27. KILLARNEY-DUBLIN.

An interesting day's drive with a stop first for photos of the Rock of Cashel where St. Patrick preached. Later, horseracing country and a visit to the IRISH NATIONAL STUD at Kildare, whose fine thoroughbreds command respect on the racecourses of the world. Drive across the Curragh and, later this afternoon, arrive in the Irish capital.

DAY 7, Friday, September 28. DUBLIN.

A day to experience the vibrant atmosphere of Ireland's "Fair City." Your city tour in the company of a local guide includes statue-lined O'Connell Street, elegant Georgian squares, and St. Patrick's Cathedral. Then a highlight visit to Oscar Wilde's TRINITY COLLEGE, famous for the 1,200-year-old Book of Kells and the magnificent Old Library. The rest of the day is free for you to further explore the city on your own. Your tour director can give the best dining advice for tonight.

DAY 8, Saturday, September 29. DUBLIN. GLENDALOUGH EXCURSION.

Vistas of Wicklow Mountains appear as you head south towards Glendalough. At its VISITOR CENTER see the engaging audiovisual show "Ireland of the Monasteries," and let your local guide explain the ruins of one of the centers of Irish Celtic Christianity founded by St. Kevin. Nearby pause to take in the spectacular views from POWERSCOURT GARDENS. Back in Dublin, the rest of the day is at leisure. Tonight's optional recommendation: a traditional Irish dinner and cabaret show to celebrate your visit to Ireland. (FB)




IRISH NATIONAL STUD

History

In the sixteenth century the lands around Tully came into the possession of the Sarsfield family. It is highly probable that Patrick Sarsfield the famous General was born there, circa 1650. In 1900, Colonel William Hall-Walker, son of a Scottish brewer, purchased a farm at Tully, Kildare and started to breed thoroughbred horses. His remarkable success is the best tribute to his policies on breeding and management which have been described as 'inspired', 'preposterous' and 'eccentric'. In 1915 he gave the Stud as a gift to the British Crown, who in return bestowed on him the title Lord Wavertree. Tully continued as the British National Stud Company until in 1943 it was handed over to the Irish Government. In 1945 The Irish National Stud Company was formed, to promote the interests of the Irish Bloodstock Industry, which it continues to do today.

MONASTIC CELLS

The most powerful and most remote example of Irish monasticism can be found seven miles into the Atlantic, on Skellig Mhichíl, off the coast of Co. Kerry. Its power is described as 'spiritualism with a blow torch'. It is where monasticism in Ireland is closest to nature. The garden draws from this power by setting upon a craggy rock outcrop of fissured limestone, and surrounded by water, a stone hermitage. Constructed of stone, the cells are of similar dimensions to those found on the Skelligs. They stand, not as a relic or as a true archaeological representation, but for their sculptural, theatrical and spiritual value.
























Wicklow Mountains
